- 2. We have vacant positions in Extension leadership, and we also have a few counties FCS educator positions
- 2. Our members have experienced some challenges with getting in-person enrollment for face-to-face classes offered.
- 3. Our affiliate members feel that connection has been limited, and do not feel valued by the University and college.
- 4. We continue to work collectively statewide to show our contributions and impact to Extension Administration.
- 5. No central University of Idaho Extension online (web) location or platform for online/recorded free programs (non-credit)
